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**Public Water Supply District #2 – Peer Review Mid-Point Report  
New Information Added to Project Website**

August 11, 2015 – At the Water District’s Regular Meeting on August 5<sup>th</sup> and again at a Special Meeting the evening of August 6<sup>th</sup> the Water District’s consultant, Black and Veatch, provided a presentation to the public on the Mid-Point Report. As requested by customers during these meetings, the Board has added more information to its website including Board members’ contact information and the Water District’s By-Laws. In June Black and Veatch, a leading global engineering, consulting and construction company, began an evaluation of the Lake St. Louis Sewer Improvement Program, an evaluation of various other alternatives, and an evaluation of possible impacts on property values from the Program and the various alternatives. The firm was selected, with assistance and input from community members who previously served on the Lake Saint Louis Sewer Program Advisory Committee, as the most qualified professional engineering firm from a larger pool of interested firms. A not-to-exceed contract amount of \$128,869.00 was approved for the review and evaluation work.

A final report from Black and Veatch, summarizing all of their findings, is expected to be presented in October. A time and location of the meeting will be selected by the Board in September.

The Lake St. Louis Sewer Improvement Program is a proactive effort to evaluate and potentially upgrade or replace the sewers that currently run underneath both Lakes St. Louis and St. Louise.
